Our trash contract will expire in October of this year so this will be going out to bid in August.

Administrator's Report

The Village taxes are paid at check for \$138,368.49 was hand delivered. And the DTE process has been started. After that our tax issue will have been resolved.

Gas and Oil Company reached out to the Village for a permit on the roads regarding a oil pad that is being constructed on County 33, which will involve Fernwood, Main Street and Canton Road.

Spoke USDA regarding grant and update on Wintersville

Spoke with Grant Coordinator with OMEGA.

May 25, 2023 Global insurance will be here to meet with any employees that would like to get supplement insurance.

AEP Pole at Water tank will need up dated due to its age. AEP is going to give us a cost of the pole to handle current meter system, new meter system and anything else. The Village will have to pay 40% of this cost. Core and Main also Quicksall will also be informed of the cost when I get it.

Chief Vandeborne asked is I would help with the COPS Grant which was due the 14th I have the first part done.

The 15th of May eight more benches were ordered which will take 8-10 weeks and will be delivered to the Street Department.

On the Security for the Building we want to add key fobs for the doors and also main door we are looking at a buzzer that will release the door.

May 5, 2023 about 7:00 PM, Meridian Green had a water break, service line, turned off service at main what was to be an hour job turned into 4-5 hours. Shut off valve was broke which affect 16 people. It was flooding on part of the property. Plumber was to come Saturday, on Monday they still did not have water. Tuesday Mr. Plumber from Cranberry Twp was to come. The part they needed was not going to be available until the following Tuesday. Randy Baska explained that the valve and pipe used was not correct and the valve was not expected until the following Monday. Mayor called Water Transport for the residence. They got it temporally fixed. Then was completely fixed the following Tuesday.

The CD at Main Street Bank will mature on August 2 or 8th then we can pull it and put into First National Bank.

Randy Spence: Great job working together on getting the problem fixed at Meridian Green.

The Gas and Oil agreement is that a non-compete clause or a contract on fixing roads.
