Jefferson Couty Health District gave \$2,500.00 to Steel Valley for storage and maintenance on vehicle. The Ride Share is doing well.

Mayor's Report

Estimate on Oil Products, Riley Petroleum\$4,500.00 Concrete M & A \$5,700, New System for Diesel and gas was Landmark \$14,000.00.

We will be doing the work for the pad.

Jesse Kosegi: We still have to pay for the installation.

Gael Damron: Are you still going to bid out the Fuel?

Mayor Petrella: Yes.

Talked with AEP Customer Service and starting 2024 we will be starting to convert all our Street lights to LED, the project will rape up in 2025 and will not cost the tax payer anything.

Received an anonymous letter asking about the road going into Ferguson's House of Furniture by McDonald's this is not a Village Road. The second question they asked about Main Street from Kroger's to the High School. There is probably not going to spend any money on Cadiz Road until next year. We're hoping to have the road completely redone next year. And lastly the Indian Creek Flags, in the past Indian Creek would always pay for the banners that would go down by the school and the Village would hang them for free. We asked Indian Creek to do the same thing with the new banner to put Indian Creek Banners up and they did not want to participate anymore that is why there are no Indian Creek Banners anymore.

Pennie Scarpone: What is the durability and life span in the Themo Plastic lines.

Mayor Petrella: Regular lines maybe a year, Themo Plastic a minimum of 5 year if not longer.

Thank you everyone we had a great summer parks program. Thank you Nicole Knight the instructor down there, she did a great job, the largest amount of kids we have ever had. Thank You Nicole and to the kids for participating. Thank you to Jesse for paying for the last day Pizza Party.

While we are discussing the Parks I want to thank Officer Barbetta, we had some vandalism at Walnut Park he use the new camera and apprehended the two juveniles that did the vandalism.

August 31, 2023 is Day of Giving we have volunteer coming to paint the Water Garage. Last year they did the old Police Station on Lenoard Ave. If anyone would like to Volunteer it should start at 9:00AM.

Infiniti Electric recycling Pennie Scarpone and myself took a tour of the recycling facility here in Wintersville they have 15 employees. They are in the bottom of Ferguson House of Furniture.

Thank You Grit Gear Apparel for doing K-9 T-shirt and a portion goes back to the K-9.

Administrator's Report

Myself and Randy Spence went to Main Street Bank to pull the CD out and take it to First National Bank.

The Policy and Procedure there was a question asked if there was a contract, I have not signed a contract but it will be for 12 to 16 Months. Gael Damron will also be involved with this.

Waste Water Treatment Plant we need to have a study done mandated by the EPA. W. E. Quicksall is going to do a 3 part study on the flow of the sewage and storm water that is going into the Waste Water Treatment Plant. There is an issue with the Storage and the flow

capacity. We did update the SADA system which is going to help us in the report. Has to be signed by Jim Jenkins who over sees the Waste Water Treatment Plant, who is the actual operator of the plant and is doing the work on that. Part one will cost \$10,500 to \$11,500. Part two is \$12,000 to \$13,000. Part three \$12,500 to \$13,500.

Motion by Pennie Scarpone, second by Carmen DeStefano to approve the Waste Water Treatment Plant upgrades and study not to exceed \$40,000.00.

W. E. Quicksall gave an estimate on Morrow Lane and Furda Lane at \$142,113.00. John McDevitt gave an estimate of \$56,000.00. But I have not got the Final Bill from Quicksall on what they have done so far.

Sanitation bids went out August 1 it is a 3 year bid beginning October 1 2023 to September 30, 2026. Bids will open August 30, 2023 at 2:00 PM.

Dumpster are owned by the businesses, I am going to be sending out letters to businesses that needs their dumpsters repaired.

Just A reminder residence who have needles in their trash out in the open we are not going to pick up your trash. We don't want our employees begin stuck by one of them.

Those businesses that don't have dumpsters are getting letter stating they will need to get dumpster.

No wood, metal or construction material in the trash.

Randy Spence: When does the contract end for our trash?

Mayor Petrella October 27, 2023.

Jesse Kosegi: 2023 Paving project, Rex Avenue, Russell, Day Circle, Woodridge, Simpson and Patton the bids go out on August 24, 2023. Right now we are \$50,000 over budget compared to last year. We talked with Quicksall, 2 inch minimum asphalt, there are catch basins that needs fixed which was not in the budget, curbs needs repaired. Randy Baska and Myself will go around and check these.

I talked with Trebell about the aggregate the two companies Archer Energy and Energy Habor are the 2 lowest with energy it is a 19 month contract.

Mayor Petrella: I don't think we should go with either one until Jake Linn reviews the contract.

Pennie Scarpone: Residence can go out and get their own.

Jesse Kosegi: Regarding the Tax issue of \$138,000 we are cleared by the State of Ohio. We did get a refund check back from the auditors of \$14,399.13.

Unfinished Business

Pennie Scarpone: Garden Drive and Meadow Road may need trenched out next year.

Carmen DeStefano: On the recreational vehicles in drive ways, did we find anything out about that.

Jake Linn: I will have to look into it.

Randy Spence: Do we have an update on the Wall on Parkview?

Jesse Kosegi: We got the Survey done which started back in March or April. July 6th they did the survey he will send me an email next week.

Randy Spence: Any word on the Pump Station on private property?

Jake Linn: I have not had a contact with the attorney for the gentlemen that owns the property and has not given a price on the property.

Gael Damron: There was no easement done?

Jesse Kosegi: The easement was done 25 years ago and it has been redone.

New Business

Mayor Petrella: Council in your packets is the Fund Status and Appropriation for July and August.

Randy Spence: Water line break, George said we had to tear a road up, is AEP going to pay us or reimburse us for the street, line, fuel and people we used to fix the line.

Mayor Petrella: Yes.

Randy Spence: On our Financial computer we have here at the building the last Financial individual used, there is data on there from different municipalities not Wintersville, if that data gets breached are we responsible for that.

Jake Linn: Public records if they are not Wintersville business we don't have a duty to preserve them. It would be a good practice to contact the other municipalities and ask them if they would like copies sent to them.

Gael Damron: Reminder of the Friendship dog show Labor Day weekend public is welcome.
